After six events of close competition, Vaughan had 25 pts to 24 for McComas and 23 for Short. The 56# WT OVER THE BAR was won by Vaughan with a record toss of 15' 2" as McComas barely missed and the order of finishers remained the same.

The CABER competition was of interest as Short won with a turn of a  $19'\ 11''$  (c130#) log; cut to  $18'\ 10''$  (c120#), Vaughan managed a turn which held second until McComas' third try which moved him into second place until Vaughan's third effort which was a wee bit better. Tom Hall was fourth.

Vaughan threw a slightly light 56# WT off a very sandy, soft surface for a new U. S. best of 37' 2", bettering his own best U. S. mark of 36' 8" set in 1977. He also set other field records in the 22# HAMMER (84' 6"), the 28# WT (67' 10 1/2") and the 56# WT OVER THE BAR (15' 2"). Results: Scoring 6-4-3-2-1

GRANDFATHER MOUNTAIN HIGHLAND GAMES - July 8, Linville, NC

A good turnout of top U. S. heavies were assembled for this 23rd renewal of the Grandfather Mountain Games. A special feature this year was the presence of Bill Anderson, Scottish and World Champion, for the first time on the East Coast of the U. S. Ballantine's Scotch Whiskey, sponsor of five American Scottish Games was again responsible for Bill's appearance. Other athletes were Fred Vaughan (SC), Ron Short (NC), Ed McComas (MD), George MacAulay (Bahamas), Keith Tice (CA), Mike Lebel (NC), Mike Reid (MD), Chauncy Wallace (FL) Gordon Varnedoe (CA) and Arnold Pope (NC).

Anderson was outstanding as usual winning six out of seven events setting field records in four of them. His outstanding effort was in the 56# WT FOR DISTANCE which is a bit on the heavy side. Bill threw 38' 1", breaking the old record by 6' 4 1/2". He bettered the 22# HAMMER record by 27' (110' 10"); 28# WT by 3' 8" (74' 9 1/2") and the 56# WT FOR HT by 1' (14' 6").

Short won the SHEAF TOSS to keep Bill from sweeping the competition. Vaughan placed second in the overall, followed by Short (3rd) and McComas (4th).

Bill's presence at Grandfather Mountain was greatly appreciated by athletes and spectators alike as evidenced by the attention he aroused from many who in the past have had no idea of what Heavy Events competition is all about.

# <u>VIRGINIA SCOTTISH GAMES</u> - July 22, Alexandria, VA, Episcopal High School, <u>U. S. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP HIGHLANDS HEPTATHLON</u>.

A crowd in excess of 10,000 was on hand for the Fifth Annual Virginia Games and Second U. S. Heptathlon Championship. After a touch and go battle throughout an incredibly humid and hot (98°) seven hour competition, Ron Short of Winston-Salem, NC emerged as the new champion edging out Fred Vaughan (2nd), Keith Tice (Clovis, CA) (3rd), and Ed McComas (4th), the previous four time winner at the V.S.G.

A field of 23 competitors were vying for prize money and awards in excess of \$2,000.00. The remaining scorers were Michael Reid (5th), Peter Hoyt (6th), Jim Pauli (7th) and Joel Keefer (8th).

Short had outstanding efforts and games records in the 56# WT (35' 11") and SHEAF (23' 7") and a new personal record of 72' in the 28# WT. He also won the CABER competition which finally had to be thrown for distance when the regulation log was broken. (This is certainly a non-recommended way of throwing the CABER and should be prevented by having a couple of spares of suitable size).

After regular competition in the HAMMER, Keith Tice, the winner, was given three extra throws with a cane handled implement and succeeded in establishing a new Games and U.S. record of 94' 1" (breaking McComas' 92' 5 1/2" set in 1976).

Once again the Virginia Games were well run and announced by Peter Dove, Betsy Roberts, Dave MacKenzie and John Severance.

Ron Short, as champion will be given transportation to Scotland to compete for the Saint Andrews Society of Washington, DC and he plans to enter the World CABER Championship at Aberdeen in June, 1979.

This inaugaural event took place on an ideal field below the Fort in hot and humid weather. The athletic events were unusual in that the 60 meter dash and standing broad jump (which are not part of the recognized nine Scottish Heavy Events) were contested along with three regular Heavy Events (19# STONE; 56# WT DISTANCE" 56# WT FOR HT) and a 40# HAMMER and CABER FOR DISTANCE (also not Scottish Heavy Events).

Nevertheless, a spirited competition took place as eight competitors strove for the championship. Among them were regulars Pete Hoyt (Altamonte Springs, FL), Tom Hall (Hatfield, PA), and John MacDonald (Bridgewater, NY).

The overall winner was George Crandall of Schenectady, NY who, by virtue of winning the CABER FOR DISTANCE, DASH, and BROAD JUMP, nosed out Hoyt and Hall who tied for second with two firsts apiece.

Keith Tice (Clovis, CA) had an outstanding day, winning the overall championship with little competition. Dick Shelton of Santa Clara, CA competed with a badly bruised right shoulder caused by a fall during Highland wrestling at the Portland, OR Games. Thus he threw left handed only (which makes his 97' 10 3/4" HAMMER THROW all the more amazing). Tice set three Games records (16# HAMMER: 116' 2 3/4"), (28# WT: 70' 4") and (56# WT FOR HT: 14' 1"). The HAMMER THROW is a new U. S. best.

The First East Durham Scottish Games featured another overall win by Ed McComas, (Baltimore) and a very close competition between Pete Hoyt (Altamonte Springs, FL) and Jim Pauli (Penn Hills, PA) which ended in a tie for second place.

McComas won six events and established a new U. S. record in the 56# WT with a toss of 37' 10" (the Delco Wt.). Hoyt won the SHEAF TOSS and had a personal best in the 56# WT and took turns with Pauli in winning or losing events by small margins all day. Pauli achieved personal records in five events and tied another as he continued his weekly improvement.

FERGUS HIGHLAND GAMES - August 12, 1978, Fergus, Ontario, Canada

THE CANADIAN NATIONAL HEAVY EVENTS and BALLANTINE'S CABER CHAMPIONSHIP

Attendance: 32,000 Temperature: 85°

Although this was the 33rd meeting of the Fergus Games, it was the First Canadian National Championship in the Heavy Events as well as the First Canadian Games in recent memory to contest all of the regular Scottish throws. Thanks to extensive publicity through radio, television, and newspapers, the presence of Bill Anderson and most of the top U. S. and Canadian heavies, a record crowd of about 32,000 turned out (up from an average of about 25,000).

Bill Anderson of Aberdeen, Scotland won six events, establishing field records in the 26# STONE (35' 10 3/4"); 56WT (38" 9 3/4"; 22# HAMMER (113' 1"); 28# WT (72' 1/4"); and 56#WT OVER THE BAR (15' 6"). He was tied in the regular CABER by Ron Short (Winston-Salem, NC). Bill's 56# WT and 22# HAMMER throws are new North American All-Comers records bettering his own 38' 1" and 110' 10" set at Grandfather Mountain, NC, 7/8/78. Bill scored 59 points for the championship.

Typically of a Games in which Anderson appears, the real contest was for second place and by the end of the day 4 1/2 points separated the No. 2 man from the No. 5 finisher. This time out Keith Tice (Clovis, CA), who has been improving consistently from week to week, took the honors. He finished not lower than 4th in any event and had two seconds, including a new  $\frac{U.S.}{V}$  Record in the 22# HAMMER of  $\frac{96'}{2}$  1/2" breaking his own record of  $\frac{94'}{1}$  (Virginia Scottish Games,  $\frac{7}{22}$ /78). Keith also had personal records in the 56# WT FOR HT (15') and DISTANCE (35' 7'), and scored 37 1/2 points.

Ed McComas (Baltimore, MD) finished 3 points behind Tice in 3rd with his strongest performance since June. His performance was also noteworthy (as well as Michael Reid's) in that he drove the eleven hours from Baltimore to Fergus the day before. Ron Short came in fourth overall 1/2 point behind Ed and had excellent efforts in the 56# WT and CABER (tied Anderson in the regular CABER). Fred Vaughan (North Myrtle Beach, SC), finished one point behind Short with 33 points. Michael Reid (Monkton, MD), was sixth with 13 points; Pete Hoyt (Altamonte Springs, FL), was seventh (8 1/2 points) and Arnold Pope (Fayetteville, ND), was eighth (6 1/2 points).

The Canadian athletes were at a decided disadvantage as they had never seen most of the events before but it was evident that the interest and potential is there and we can expect Canadians to become very good in all events. The highest Canadian finisher was Dave Harrington (Ottawa), a former world class discus thrower. Dave and many of the other Canadians at Fergus such as Bob Whitman, Mike Milligan, Hugh McCarron and Dave Theriault, showed great potential to become very good heavies.

An interesting feat of strength is held annually at the Fergus Cames. It is called the Fergus Walk and the object is to grasp a 185 1b weight in each hand and walk as far as possible with it. This year Mike Milligan, Bob Whitman and some other very strong lads put on a good show with Bob (Barrie, Ontario), emerging as the victor with a walk of around 359 feet.

Clayton Howard (Fergus) and Tim Kincaid (Houston, TX), did an excellent job in officiating and judging the events. The Fergus Chamber of Commerce (W. A. Gelger, President; J. F. Campbell, Chairman; and Ed MacRae, Secretary) as sponsors, did an excellent job of setting up, promoting, and running the Games. Ballantine's Scotch showed keen interest in the Championship and put up the prize money for the Heavy Events.

The Fergus Games were sanctioned by the North American Scottish Games Association (NASGA).
